

# Current Research in Substance Misuse Services

# Study: Investigating all-cause mortality in the substance misuse treatment population

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Members of staff at Derbyshire Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust are conducting a study to explore risk factors and the clinical care of people who have been under the care of our substance misuse services. Your data may be being used for this study if you have accessed our substance misuse services for addiction to an illegal drug at any point between the 1 January 2012 and 31 December 2020.

#### What does this study involve?

A small number of researchers from the Trust who work on this study access patient records and link it to some other data sources (such as reports from coroners, the police and the ambulance service). All data is stored on our NHS Trust servers. Some personally identifiable data (name, address, NHS number and date of birth) is sent to NHS Digital, so that they can tell us if someone has died and what the cause of the death was. This is done securely, according to the terms of a data sharing agreement, and in line with strict legal and ethical guidelines. No diagnosis or treatment data is sent to NHS Digital.

All data used is anonymised and summarised before it is published. No service user's care would be negatively affected by being in this study. This project has been approved by the Health Research Authority and the East Midlands - Nottingham NHS Research Ethics Committee.
