

Transforming Community Mental Health Care in Derbyshire

Living Well Living WELL Derbyshire

Here in Derbyshire we have a programme of work underway over the next three years to transform our community mental health services. This programme is called **Living Well** and its aim is to make sure people get the right support, in the right place, at the right time.

This means we will be developing closer relationships with other services in our communities, including GP's, social care services, as well as people in the voluntary sector and peer supporters. Sometimes people have difficulties moving between services, or getting access to some services, the **Living Well** project will help make sure this doesn't happen. If people need high levels of support this will still be available through our mental health teams and hospital wards but will now be improved by working closely with others who can help. **Living Well** is about bringing services together to help people get well and stay well, and may include support with employment, welfare benefits, physical health issues or taking part in activities or groups.

Patients and carers will be at the heart of developing these new ways of working and will guide us to make the right decisions in each area of Derbyshire. The pilot is already running in the High Peak and has produced positive results. Work is also beginning in Derby City and will be followed by Chesterfield, North Derbyshire and the Derbyshire Dales. Mental Health Helpline - Help for Patients and Carers

Mental health support is available to Derbyshire residents of all ages through a mental health helpline run by Derbyshire Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust and P3. It is a free phone number and calls from landlines or mobiles should be free. The helpline is open **24 hours a day, seven days a week**.

The mental health helpline provides support to people who are in immediate distress, or help to their families or carers to seek support. During the call you will be supported by an experienced health practitioner who will make every effort to support you over the phone, or signpost you to available services or resources. Debt and Money Advice Derbyshire and Derby City

In **Derbyshire** the Welfare Rights Service offer free welfare benefits check to ensure you are receiving all the benefits you are entitled to. They can also offer support with appeals against claim decisions and help you get in touch with debt and financial advice. Free digital online support for all carers

Mobilise is a free, online source of support for carers from across the country, designed to help each other look after loved ones.

Mobilise provide:

- An online support package with key information and practical advice gathered from other carers across the country
- Online video call with a small group of other carers for about 45 mins called 'online cuppas' where you can talk about things that are important to you in your caring role
- Online tools that provide further information for common queries e.g. carers allowance, blue badge eligibility and emergency planning
- A 24/7 website with a web chat support service that responds Mon-Sun between 8am and 10pm, online peer support discussion groups
