Being an NHS Foundation Trust (FT) means that control is put into the hands of staff, patients, service users, carers, partner organisations and the public who all have the opportunity to become members, and thereby influence decisions made by the Trust.

The FT provides free healthcare services to its local communities based on their needs. We are regularly inspected to ensure that our services are consistently meeting the same standards of service and care as all NHS Trusts across the country.

- Contribute to the Trust's strategic direction
- Be eligible to receive NHS discounts including discounts off holidays, insurance and at local restaurants and shops.
